



New Country Kitchen

Demolishing a massive chimney breast and rationalising a warren of cramped rooms created a contemporary & light open-plan family kitchen



Before



The project brief was simple: enlarge and modernise a dark, cramped and dated kitchen in a substantial country home. The solution was more complex, but enhanced the character of the aged building whilst adding a contemporary twist.

Removing a central chimney which housed an old range cooker opened up the interior space substantially, whilst demolishing the disused lean-to boiler house provided the opportunity to install a bespoke oak-framed glass extension with oversized glazed doors, creating a transitional indoor|outdoor space and terrace for al-fresco dining.

The size of the new open-plan kitchen better fits the nature of the house, and the adjacent dining space equally suits a leisurely family brunch as it does informal entertaining.
